(9) Preliminary to clearing the Great Temple Building 500, I set men to work examining the low ground north of the temple. Two trenches (or rather excavations) were put in one A near the pylon, another B in the mass of potsherds (see Feb. 8).

In trench A, there are fragments of walls on a distinct floor (1). These are partly red brick and resemble the walls of 100. There is little pottery. In fact, I am greatly struck by the complete absence of antiquities (not only in the Pyr. chambers, but also) in the debris in the buildings. In the W. end of Trench A is another floor (2) 15-20 cm above (1) but this may be only a
