(35) debris, was the lower part of a seated statuette of:

This is a votive statuette⁴⁵ similar in material, attitude, style etc to the frag. of Bek-en-wer. H. 32 cm.

- (2) Bldg. 500, Trench D. At NW corner [DRAWING] cut a rectangular hole down through 160 cm of debris. Still going down in red sand (damp) apparently natural detritus.
- (3) Bldg 500, trench A. Have cleared away layer under "upper floor" up to foundation of pylon [DRAWING]. This is a single layer of large stones and shows that the "upper floor" was the floor of that pylon. The statues were under this floor.
- (4) Continued clearing well in first court of the Taharka Temple at Merowe,. Hard damp debris,--cont. frags. alab, vessels and frags. granite.
