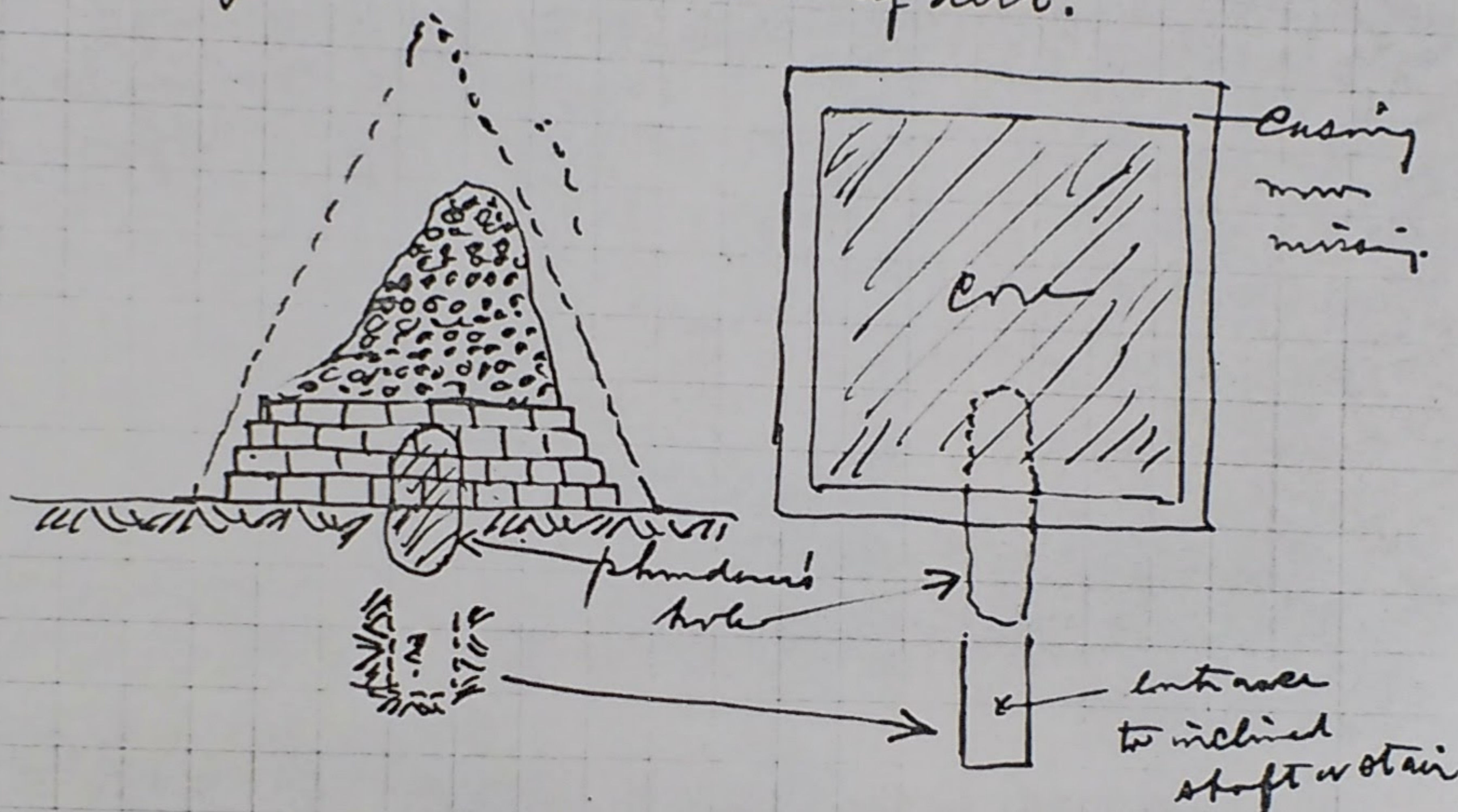

A hole in the middle of the S. side enters
the core and penetrates into the ^{hard sand} ~~rock~~ above
the stairway, but it is not yet clear
whether it reached the chamber. [apparently
a modern unsuccessful attempt to
reach the chamber].

No trace of chapel preserved.
