Work on (1) B 501 EX 4, (2) "N" of B 802, (3) B 801,  
(4) Pylon I B 800.

(1) B 501 EX 4  
Mar 2nd

Continued clearing in area B 501 EX 4, following red sandstone pavement "N". In hole broken through this pavement found frag. of grey gran. sculpture, a sharply bent elbow of a small figure, which was found to fit on to the fragment 16-4-275 (part of figure of a prostrate captive. Discontinued work here at noon.

(2) "N" of B 802: --  
Mar 2nd

Started clearing to the "N" of B 802, working "W" along outer face of 802-II. Small gang in the morning, and then main force (Egyptian + local) in the afternoon. Debris to a depth ca 75 cm. Indications of masonry walls N of the "NE" corner of B 802, which are not yet clearly exposed.

(3) B 801 :--  
Mar 2nd

Cleaning work in "SW" part of B 801. Removed blocking of entrance to stairway running up "S" against the "E" face of Pylon 800-I, "S" half. Clearing stone pavement below the level of stairway end, and below the sections of column drums incorporated into the "S" wall of 801.

(4) Pylon I B 800 :--  
Mar 2nd

Cleared along "W" face of Pylon I, "N" of doorway, and exposed flag staff niches (2), corresponding to those of the "S" half exposed yesterday. These niches had been blocked up with red sandstone blocks so as to form a continuous line of the front face of pylon.
