In the afternoon uncovered another abacus fallen in room 502 III 1:

In II 2 found a small red block carefully inscribed.

Work continued also in "SW" quarter. The "W" wall has a number of registers in sunk relief. The second from above as preserved shows boats on river. [Drawing] But the wall is badly weathered. In the corner is a heap of fallen stones.

[Drawing] The sand and stones are damp with moisture. The sands showed wet at a depth of only about 30-50 cm. The stones were so wet as to be cheesy. So we shifted the men to the "N" to allow the stones to dry before excavating.

Finished clearing crude brick enclosing wall on "S" of 504.
