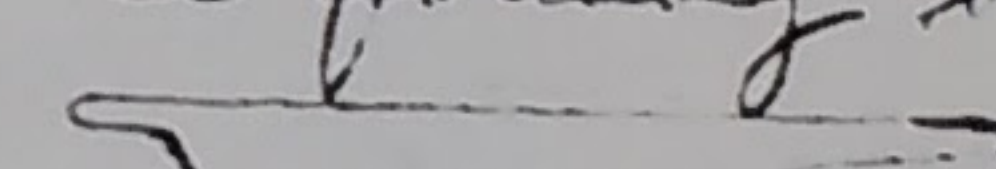


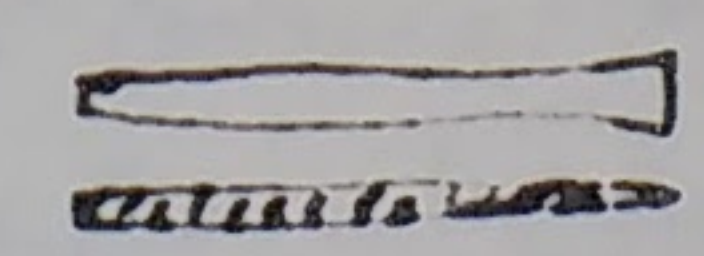

heap of pottery in the foundation deposit  
under the E. L. corner of 519 (see photos).  
Under these, there were a lot of small  
bell beads (amethyst), ~~and then the~~  
several small frag. of blue colored  
matter and the following large models:  
2 knives  L. 12.3  
(one has traces for a bone handle).

4 adze blades  L. 6.7-6.9  
(two with decayed ends)

2 broad chisels  L. 6.8 and 6.3

4 (or more) long chisels  L. <sup>8.1</sup> 7.5; 7.5; 6.5.

3 axe-heads  L. 4.2; 4.3; 4.6.

1 frag. bone (fortuitous).

1 jar  solid handles. Ordinary brownware  
as N. 8 and later  
N. 8.

2 vase  same ware
