The excavation in front of B 200 has now exposed the "N" face of the "N" wall of the hall of col. (Hathor) of B 300.

The small masonry wall appears to be a rough retaining wall built on debris

and backed by debris. It is very doubtful whether it has any connection with the rough large-stone masonry in front of B 200.

Jan. 19.

Work on 503 and 502.

In 503, had a man clearing odd places and removing two very decayed drums of the large cols. The stone on breaking is very white with an occasional pink streak, but weathers reddish on surface. Found the remains of two cols. of older smaller stone temple (First Temple) under col.[?] "N" first on "E"

[Drawing]

I would construct with at least 14 cols and probably 20 cols. The drain in the "NW" corner belongs to the small masonry and indicates

that 503 was in this period an open colonnade. Therefore the reconstruction with 14 cols is more probable.

In 502, worked to walls in I to IV 7 and stopped work here just about 11 a.m. (see EX. "N"). Continued in "W" side, but no fresh developments. Below the boats "W" wall "S" half, is a fig. of king (→ "N") with a man \*[Drawing] → "N" in front of him and a servant leading a horse behind him.
