It appears to have been covered when the portico was built (provided it was found where it lies, a fact vouched for by Jackson Pasha). The room inside is filled with rubbish and a bank of red sand washed down from above. Over-all broken building stones.

[DRAWING] The face has been torn off the part of the pylon still preserved. On a stone in the portico debris, was part of the group of captives in the scene given by Cailliaud (Pl. LXI).
