[Drawing] 316 cm wide was left

in the gray sandstone masonry of small blocks (1 ell x ½ ell x % ell). The ends were then covered with a yellow stone casing

of small masonry each 82 cm thick leaving a space of 152 cm. The ends of the grey wall and the yellow casing have been denuded to the level of pavement II. This denuded and apparently foot-worn area has a width of about 400 cm (or more). That is the reconstruction indicated by pavement II included a widening of doorway 503. This is all fairly clear. But the difficulty comes in discovering the lines of the parts [posts?] <u>a</u> and <u>b</u> of earlier doorway. The yellow jambs (y, y) do not extend to the "W" side of wall. After photo and drawing, I removed stones of pavement II from over <u>a</u>, but the part below does not seem to correspond with b. I am afraid I shall have to clear away nearly the whole of pavement II over this end of door 503.

- N.B. The doorways are named from the rooms they enter coming in from "W" or from axis of temple. The outer door is doorway 501. Doorway 503 is that from 502 to 503.
