the "southern most" niche in "W" face of pylon (area I 1) circular bronze sheath for base of flag pole, in place on floor of niche. The circumference is indicated in debris, and part of the bronze is preserved. The debris within the ring of bronze is of a dark color indicating decayed wood. Columns a, a², a³, and a⁴ are now clear, and the spacing was

observed to be irregular, and not to correspond with the spacing of the "f" row at "N". a², a³, and a⁴ are close together, and if a door existed in the south face, it must have been "W" of a4.

In area IV 4, while clearing out compartments of red brick complex on floor, level[?], came on shoulder and upper area of frag. of dark grey granite, about life size. Between biceps and shoulder a band with unpolished surface indicates an amulet. From the same

locality came a frag. in finely worked and highly pol. dark grey granite: back block of a statue (?), with frag. of a Horus name in sunk

Metawali worked today on the bud brick walls of B 850 tracing out the different constructions. There are at least two buildings here. The earlier with plastered (mud) outer[?] wall surfaces, and white plastered + painted room walls. The later building, built over this, appears to have been at a higher level as no doors are traceable, the existing walls having foundation compartments. The floor level of rooms of the earlier building are ca 75 cm. to 1.00 meter above foundation course of the later building. Later walls
