

- Feb 6th 1920 Friday 108 ½ Locals.
 51st Day of work: -- Work on (1) Dump Heap in "SE" corner B 501, and
 (2) cleaning up work in B 904 and adjacent thereto.
 (made by Prof. Breasted)
- (1) B 501. Work continued clearing away old dump heap^ in B 501 "SE", above areas II 1, 2, 3, III 1, 2, + 3. In II 2, 3 + III 2, 3 work is down to surrounding level of undisturbed surface of drift, and there still remains only a small amount of the upstanding dump to "S". At "N" limit of this work, about 3rd row of cols. from "S" wall, down ca. 1.00 below adjacent natural surface, in dark, dirty dust + sand debris. Following columns have appeared today: 3rd col "N" in 1st row (from "E"), 2nd Col in 2nd row, 1st col in 3rd row. (c) (b2)

- (2) B 904 etc. Work of cleaning up floor of 904 and two adjoining rooms to the "W". The floors of these three rooms are regularly paved with hard rectangular grey stones. *(Probably by Dr. Budge)
 xx = trench* cutting through "N + S" walls of B 904. A doorway, red sandstone jambs at outer corners, block[ed] up with red sandstone masonry as indicated. C = red sandstone col. in centre. Y = Doorway blocked up with mud brick. Z = Not clear owing to decay of walls here, apparently a doorway.
 W = later red sandstone wall very roughly built.
 At (x) on pavement, and buried in mud debris washed from walls was found a chisel of bronze (see p. 39)

- Feb 6th 1920 Saturday 110 Locals.
 52nd Day. Work on (1) Prof. Breasted's dump in "SE" corner B 501
 (2) Areas IV 2, IV 3, + IV 4. (3) "N" of door in "N" face 501, outside temple.
- B 501 "SE" (1) Work continued removing Prof. Breasted's dump as yesterday, and
 Feb. 7 in clearing sand against E face of Room 501 in "SE" corner, areas I1 and I2. Loose drift sand in latter two areas. The old dump is now practically cleared, except for a small part at extreme "S" on which the "N" end of railroad rests.
