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when placed in 704. At any ¹⁹⁹ ~~rate~~ rate, it was broken before the fall of the cliff buried the room. Otherwise we should have found the face. It is clear that the back and side walls of 703 and the whole of 704 were reconstructed after the temple had been crushed by a fall of rock. This was the time the statues were placed in 704, — a period clearly the same (glass, pottery, stiches etc) as that of the Bentan pyramids. This reconstruction was again buried by a fall of rock and left untouched since that time. The reliefs and cols. in place and reused are those of Atlanersa. The Senka-amen-
seken inscription on the granite altar is intusive. The Pylon inscription drawn by Bailloud must also be intusive. Senkalma-
seken is later than Atlanersa, —
probably his successor.
