(1) "W" of Doorway Pylon I B 500 : --
March 14th

Continued clearing at "W" of Doorway and "W"
of the "S" half of Pylon I.

a = granite stela

b = 1st Ram

c = 2nd Ram

d d e = "S" wall of approach
street or passage. Of
red sandst. masonry.

The face d - e is inscribed
with seated figures of divinities

(Thoth + a female divinity) is well cut low relief.
but no traces of hieroglyphics so far. Traces of the white
plaster renovation over these figures as in other parts of the
temple. The jamb d d is coated with blue painted plaster
on both "N" + "W" faces, the "E" face not being clear yet.
f = a rectangular black stone slab, partially exposed under
bank of stone debris, with incised hieroglyphics of medium
size on the under side, which could not be read in present
state of clearing.

(2) Doorway + "E" of Doorway Pylon I 500.
March 14th

Continued as previously in stone debris + fallen
blocks.

(3) B 904 "SE" Corner : --
March 14th

Completed work started yesterday. The removal of the
mud brick wall at this point showed a foundation of
small white sandstone blocks, roughly thrown together
(not laid in courses) to serve as foundation for the mud
brick structure. There are traces of this same foundation
structure visible in B 903, "E" wall.

(4) B 901 "S" Ext. Wall : --
