Bailliaud's plan is less than 400 cm.

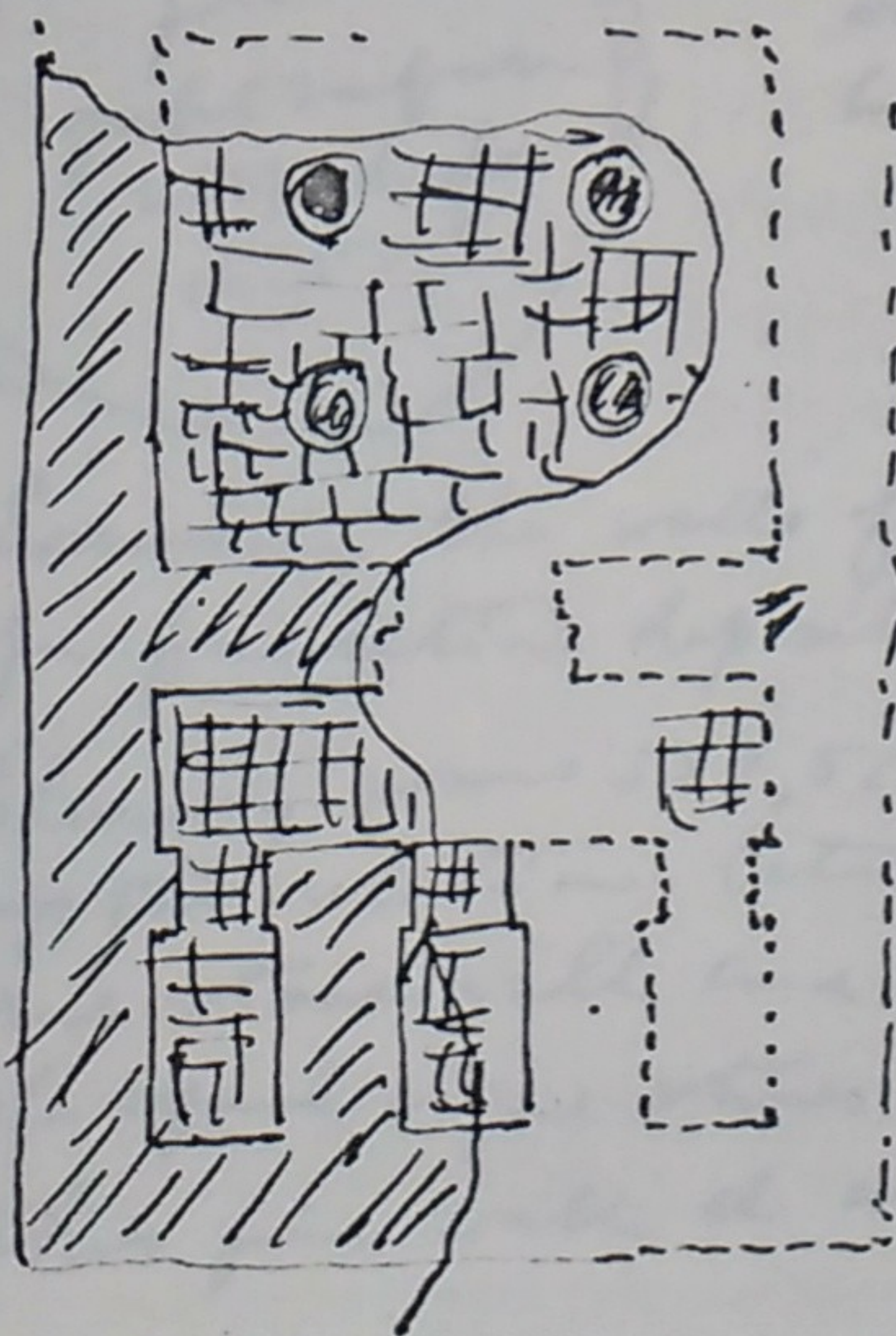
I notice evidences of three floors

- (a) old stone floor (pavement) belong to
mid-18th building and to cols.
- (b) later stone floor belonging to the
cols I have drawn as those to
800

- (c) a rough rubble floor in which
is possibly a third series of cols.

Perhaps in Bailliaud's time, a
later restoration of 800 was preserved.
There are other evidences of such a period,
for example room 801 and room 200.
