
cols. as placed on my plan are ⁽¹⁴²⁾

across from one col. to the other (10-16)
is 538-540 (539±1). The distance on
Bailliard's plan is less than 400 cm.
I notice evidence of three floors

(a) old stone floor (pavement) belong to
mid-18th building and to cols.
(b) later stone floor belonging to the
cols I have drawn as those to
800

(c) a rough rubble floor in which
is possibly a third series of cols.

Perhaps in Bailliard's time, a
later restoration of 800 was preserved.
There are other evidences of such a period,
for example room 801 and room 200.
