(3) In front of 600, a great irregular hole of recent origin. On the R. side of this, a second burial on right side head W (local E). This second burial (602) has a stone armlet (C-group type). Thus the evidence grows that <u>these</u> burials are M.E. to N.E.⁵⁴ (say 1500-1900 BC).

Owing to the change in direction of the river W is the same as N at Kerma and in lower Nubia.

D. from this and in front of 701 is an extensive pavement of red stones about in a level or a little under the level of the floor of 701.

(4) Resumed work on the complex of walls of buildings of different date hitherto called 900. The debris has been so turned over by sebbakhin and
