(1) "N" of B 802-801

Mar. 3rd

Continued work outside the "N" wall of Temple B 800, opposite rooms 802-801 working "W" to 1st Pylon. Removed dirt to depth of 50-75 cm. down to an irregular mud floor. The 1st Pylon has a big projection "N" of the exterior wall of the temple, the 2nd Pylon, between 801 and 802 a much smaller projection.
