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stands B 200 is now clear. The remains of heavy masonry with reused blocks of Thothmes

 \* III or IV are now clear. They were without doubt part of a <u>pylon</u> belonging to <u>B 200</u>. The former suggestion of a roadway<sup>14</sup> is to be discarded.

> The trenches in front of the pylon failed to disclose any further traces of walls "W" of the pylon; but about 10 meters to "W" and "S" of the axis is the circular well already mentioned cut partly in sandstone & partly in gravel.

We are now down about 8 m. So far the filling has been very dirty, -- dust, ashes, potsherds etc. In this has been found a scarab [Drawing] (<u>sic</u>), some frags. of blue fai. cups, amulets, etc. Nothing of importance but mostly <u>Ethiopian</u>.

## (2) B 300 The "N" face of the "N" wall of B 300 is now clear to its whole preserved length (i.e. from rock face to opposite 5th col (Hathor). \* The wall of heavy stones is founded on the foundation of <u>an older wall</u> (small stones (1 x ½ x <sup>4</sup>/<sub>2</sub> ell). Tirhaqa's inscription in B 303 (anteroom before three sanctuaries) says: [Drawing] "That which he made as his monument for his mother, Mut of Napata. He <u>built</u> for her a temple <u>anew</u> (i.e., he rebuilt) of stone "
