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west and on east. On the west, no trace of the foundation line of the west side could be found. The stone thrones had penetrated to the middle. We took out rubbish, drift sand, and rough pieces of red (hard) sandstone. On the east a rough line of rubble wall was found, which appeared to be the line of the ~~core~~ retaining wall of the core.

- (2) Pyramid XI (Cailland Pl. XLIX h; Pl. LVII, left middle) is the largest pyramid in the southern group (Cailland "sub-east"). In his day part of the casing was still visible at any rate on the north. The stones have been used in the modern cemetery (and church). We began clearing at what appeared to be a corner (SE corner) but the stones here visible were isolating not the corner. Trenching ~~in~~ in from well outside the possible limits
