The purpose of the pots is unclear, -- a contained dirty debris, mainly dust with ashes, coals, bones (including ox-horn) potsherds, brickbats, and stones, -- evidently thrown in. (1) They are not ovens, --owing to absence of fire marks and depth in floor. (2) They might be store-places for dates or dried vegetables (onions?) but the access is different (grain therefore out of question). (3) Perhaps refuse pits but this is hardly likely. Wall I on the inside ("S") appears to continue to "W" face of wall. Perhaps this wall was all that was built.
