

(1) B 200 Continued working → "S" along front of
Jan. 15. terrace of B 200. It is still unclear
 whether this masonry belongs to a pylon
 or to a roadway.¹³ The variation in the
 axes of the stones points rather to a
 roadway. In the debris "E" of the
 "S" part now exposed, are a few fragments
 of fai. objects of dates varying from NE to
 Meroitic. About some broken pots [Drawing]
 of brownware such as we found
 under B 700 (i.e. Atlanersa or earlier).

(2) B 500 Work continued in trenches in
Jan. 15. front of dump, in 502 kiosk, and
 in 502 "SW" quarter. In "SW" we
 have sounded the
 floor near the "W" wall
 and are now clearing
 away the fallen debris.
 (debris of decay).

(3) B 200 Having cut B 1202 with trenches
Jan. 15. ordered work started on upper debris
 in 1215, 1216, etc. Throwing the earth
 by hand into 1202. The "N" part
 (i.e., 1201 to 1205) I now propose to fill in
 that is up to the "N" side of the thick wall.
 After several days hard work the
 structure is now understandable. Today
 I removed pot a and exposed the walls
 underneath. Wall I was
 clearly built
 against Wall III
 and is later
 than wall III.
 Wall II runs
 over Wall III and
 Wall I and
 is later than both III and I. Wall IV
 is over all and is the earliest of all.
