(1) B 502
Feb. 14

Clearing B 502 V 3, VI 3, VII 3. In V 3 found a large stone with name (in relief) of ([Drawing: hieroglyphs]) Tanutamun. The evidence is beyond dispute. (1) Tanutamun built the "kiosk" (2) the "kiosk" is later than the later 48 col. plan of 502. (3) The cols of this plan have abaci with the name of ([Drawing: hieroglyphs]) = ([Drawing: hieroglyphs]) (4) The abacus with ([Drawing: hieroglyphs]) on one face and ([Drawing: hieroglyphs]) on the other is of the same workmanship, the same temple plan, and refers also to Piankhy. (5) The only Piankhy possible for the period previous to Tanutamun is Piankhy I.

* Therefore: Lepsius "Harnakht (?)", see Gauthier Livre des rois IV p. 52, is to be eliminated from lists.

* Therefore: Piankhy I conqueror of Egypt was Piankhy-Meryamon-Sabast and Wesermaatra.

* Therefore: the 72-col. plan of 502, being earlier than Piankhy, probably goes back to the XIXth dynasty (Sethos II ?).

* Therefore: Pavements I and II of B 502 are still earlier corresponding perhaps to Rameses II (pavement II) and an earlier king, -- [Drawing: hieroglyphs].
