the latest walls are not marked in the above sketch. The mud walls have be[en] gratly cut about by <u>sebah</u> digging. In the mud-brick room with the fragment of statues we cleared the RU quarter and swept the stone pavement. The fragments form four nearly complete statues, and small parts of two others. Until they are removed, no final attempt at fitting together can be made.

In the RU quarter only frags. of bases of same [?] were found and a frag. of the grey granite statue of Amon-amal (?) from 500 A (no. 3). At present we have:

Head no. 4. Taharka, appears to fit on statue No. 2 in 500 A.

Statue no. 8. Amen-ma-ne-weset,⁵⁸ headless, bk. granite, (piece 4 on p. 128 [227]).

Statue no. 9. Same (pieces 6, 7, 8 on p. 128 [227])

Statue no. 10. Unidientified (pieces 5+9 on p. 128 [227])

Statue no. 11. Senka-amon-seken. On this fits head no. 3 found in 500 A.

Thus it is clear that the two groups came from the same place, no doubt the great temple (500) which lies between and were broken before removal from that place. The new group was clearly dumped into the mud-brick room with a lot of
