Sir Herbert Jackson + Mr. Crowfoot dined at the camp this evening.

Work on (1) B 501, (2) 1st Pylon B 800. (3) "NE" corner B 802. (4) Door in "W" end B 909. (5) Statue in B 502 EX 4.

(1) B 501 : -- Continued removal of burnt brick house walls in B 501,  
March 6th in areas as follows : -- I 2, 3, II 2, 3, III 2, 3, IV 2, 3, V 2, 3, IV 4, 5, 6, 7, V 5, 6, 7, VI 5, 7, VII 5, 7, and VIII 7.

(2) 1st Pylon B 800 : -- Continued examination and cleaning of facade ("W")  
March 6th : -- of the "N" half of 1st Pylon B 800. It was at first thought that the "W" face had been refaced or repaired by the addition of a course of blocks over the old face, but removal of one block at angle of the "Southern" of the two flag staff niches showed that this was not the case. Many of these blocks along base of the face are very much weathered away, and the gaps filled with debris. There is a narrow projecting step (f.c.) at base of the "W" face of Pylon, below the flag staff niches.

(3) "NE" Corner B 802 :-- Work continued as yesterday (see Mar 5th (1)).  
March 6th The frag. of pavement noted yesterday, as well as another "S" of it and slightly higher, indicate the existence of a door leading out "N" from B 802 at two different periods. Immediately "W" of this pavement there is indication of a door jamb.
