(1) B 551 : --March 20th : -- In sections I 2, I 3, II 2, II 3, III 2, III 3, "W" and "N". The clearing "S" of the kiosk is completed, but further clearing was carried on today between kiosk walls and in "W" end of doorway in Pylon 500 I, among Meroitic intrusive walls of stone and brick. Here in "E" central part of sect. II 2 found built into lower part of a late rubble wall a grey granite slab (or frag.) the under side of which bears several lines of well cut incised hieroglyphs running horizontally including a cartouche, which could not be read owing to position of the stone.

Examination of exterior wall (on "S") of the kiosk, together with a bell cap. of moderate size found immediately inside the "S" wall, leads to the assumption that the structure was surmounted by free standing columns supporting a roof.
