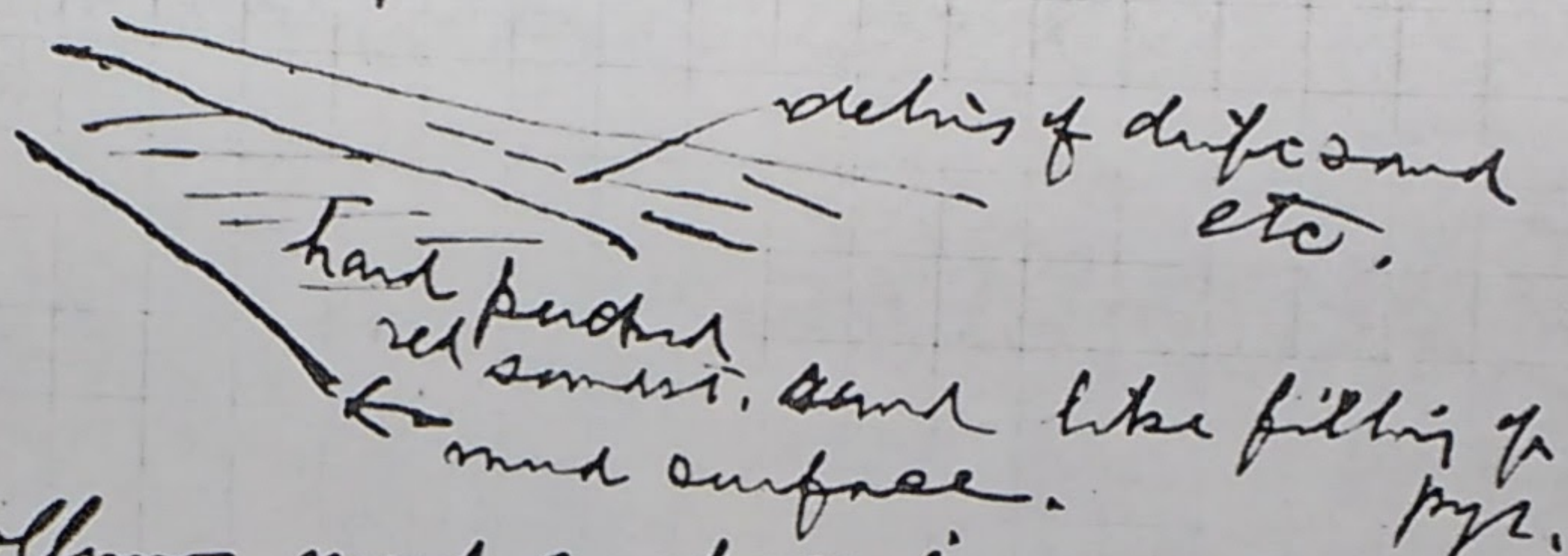

Pyramid XVI is the western
of the two "pyramides ruines"
shown by Cailliaud on Pl. XLIX (map).

It was a low mound of drift
sand and fragments of red sandstone.
The whole was cleared, showing the
lower part of the retaining wall of
the core of a small pyramid
(x meters). Height ca. 100m.

On the south or towards the river
was a wall of burnt brick, apparently
remains of a chapel.

On this same side an incline with
