(31) In the end of trench c' (at x'), found the lower part of statuette (on XXX H. ca. 60 cm) of blk. granite,--a seated figure, long garment [DRAWING: hieroglyphs] "Bek-en-wer".<sup>38</sup>  
Inscr. on both sides and down front of garment. There were also several battered frags. of sandstone statuettes:

(2) head with [DRAWING]

(3) " and shoulders of Amon (ram-headed)

(4) basis of a seated figure (male) H ca 20 cm.

(5) " " " " " H ca 40 cm (work similar to Pyr. triads)<sup>39</sup>

The portico in front of the Pylon was elevated on a platform with foundation walls to bear the cols. H. ca. 2 m. above the "gebel".

(3) Bldg 700 trench X. Following the surface of the alluvial → mud E we found traces of a heavy stone pavement. We are here without doubt in the middle of a temple,--probably not a part of 700. It is impossible to find a dumping place in this part and trench X must be abandoned. The building must be attacked from a different quarter.
