Jan. 12.] successive constructions and reconstructions of the same structure. This structure was either an open court; or, as seems certain from the unplastered inner faces and the buttresses, a filled compartment forming a platform for an open court or for light crude brick walls. The lighter walls forming 1202, 1203, 1204 are as early as period I or earlier.

Period IV can be followed over 1206-1214 by the fact that the bases of the walls are everywhere on debris and the lowest course consists of bricks on edge. [Drawing]
