Wall surfaces marked thus [Drawing] are plastered and painted, only traces of the color remaining, of which blue and yellow can be identified. It appears evident at this early stage of the clearing: -- <u>1st</u> that 850 is later than 800, and after the latter had fallen into disuse for it blocks the entrance to pylon, and is built <u>over</u> the row figures lining the approach avenue, while these figures show signs of long exposure to driving sand <u>in their present orientation</u>, the hind quarters being much eaten away. <u>2nd</u> that the existing walls are <u>foundations</u> rather than room walls (cf. the many blind compartments), but that an earlier structure with rooms at this level (cf. plastered faces) was later incorporated into a building of which this was the foundation level.
