All the drums are half circles.

The lower drums 2-4 are thicker; the upper drums much thinner (20-30 cm).

This corresponds to the size of stones in walls. No slope would have been necessary to lift these

smaller stones either in walls or in cols.

Also, -- the present cols. I to III, a - f, are of the same construction as the differently

spaced cols, IV-X, a-d.

But I to III, a-f were not cased in bronze

at the base.

We have in 502, $-\frac{2}{2}$ floors or stone pavements, below the <u>top of old stone piers</u>; an older set of <u>col</u>. piers; a later set of cols. with stone pavement IV. That is <u>four periods</u>.
