(3) B 502 Had an Egyptian examining deposits of mud Jan 31 between cols. in 502

Levels in cm.: add to 250 m, above S.L, -- Alexandria[??] D.L, 253.87 etc.

In 503, there is another floor between II and IV. It is clear that the floor IV above belongs to the period of the cols in 502 (name of Piankhy = Wesermaatra), and that floors I and II are earlier even than the sq. bases of these cols. for the tops of these foundation piers are over 20 cms above floor II. As yet no trace of earlier bases or[?] stone walls have been noted. I therefore formed the hypothesis that the earlier temple was of mud brick. Examining the space between the piers in II 5-7, it is clear that for the piers a foundation trench was dug from "E" to "W" the length of the hall.

Between cols I-II d and e, remnants of <u>mud-brick</u> (crude-brick) <u>masonry are clearly visible cut</u> <u>by the f. trenches.</u> I believe this masonry belongs to the floors I and II (stone pavements as in 800 sub and 900 sub)

- (4) B 502 EX "S" At the rectangular pit, in the "S" edge
 Jan. 31. about 10 m from "SE" corner opened a hole
 in floor of pit, the nature of which is not
 yet clear.
- (5) B 502 EX "N" Scraping the ground exposed here on Wednesday.

 Jan. 31. found a second mud-filled well about
 6 m. "W" of first. Examined outside of
 Pylon III for F. dep. in vain. Continued
 excavating debris → "W". Killed another horned viper.
