

Feb 7th (Cont) (2) Work clearing "W" from Prof. Breasted's dump, remaining upper layers
 B 501 - IV 2 - 4 of surface sand in IV 2, IV 3, + IV 4, in the latter area getting down
 Feb. 7 to pavement as found at "W" end of kiosk (area VII 4) The pavement is of
 red and brown sandstone, and the level approximately the same as in VII 4.
 In area IV 2, in drift sand, frag. of a basis of a statue in black granite,
 two parallel flat pol. faces, one with the ends of two incised hieroglyphics
 [Drawing: Hieroglyphics], and a smaller frag of the same material with modeled surface.
 In area IV 4, just above pavement, and close to "E" end of "S" wall of kiosk
 two frags incised meroitic inscrip. on grey granite. Above this last
 point bank of, debris shows clear stratification thus:

B 501 EX 3 (3) Work resumed immediately outside "N" door of B 501. Working "N"
 Feb. 7. (about 8 m. from door, and a little "west".) At ca 7 m. "N" of
 outer face [of] doorway came on brown sandstone pavement as at "W"
 + "E" of kiosk, and at approximately the same level.

(4) Trenches Started trenching "S" of the "S" dump late this afternoon.
 "S" of 500 Red "gebel" at ca 70 cm. from present surface.

(5) B 904-6¹¹ The doorway between 904 and 905
 has been blocked with crude brick
 but the door block has been
 [Drawing] partly removed on the inside. It
 may have been the width of the
 wall between 904 and 905. The
 walls ("N" and "W") in this comes

of 904 show marks of a conflagration and these
 marks affect the door-block as well as the
 walls. The heavy chisels [?] appears to have been
 under the destroyed part of the door blocks.

Ordered part of later sandstone wall removed
 from above 906 to follow crude brick walls
 under it.
