Pot <u>a</u> was set later than stone wall and later than walls III and I but earlier than Wall II. The stone wall was earlier than all.

Thus, it is <u>certain</u> that

the order of walls was as follows.

- <u>a.</u> Stone wall and small crude brick walls in 1202.
- <u>b</u>. crude brick wall III
- <u>c</u>. // // // I
- <u>d.</u> Pots <u>a</u> and <u>b</u>.
- e. Crude brick wall II
- <u>f.</u> // // IV.

Structure of \underline{b} was a large platform held up by heavy retaining walls with buttresses on the "N" and "S". The stairway leading up from 1206 belonged to this structure. The character of the superstructure is not recoverable. These walls \underline{appear} at $\underline{present}$ to connect with the walls of Aspalta in $\underline{1213}$. The building seems not to be in the usual temple plan (i.e., $\underline{perhaps}$ a \underline{palace} ?).

Wall \underline{c} (old I) was <u>built to support</u> the "N" wall of \underline{b} which had suffered from weathering (torrents running down the wadi from the pyr. field.

Structure <u>e</u> (old II) was a reconstruction [?] of the whole original building <u>or</u> a new construction of a similar building.

Structure <u>f</u> appears to be a third
