: -- Examined the laying of masonry at ca. centre of  
"N" wall of 801, at which point there is an appearance  
of there having been a doorway, though the sides are not  
parallel and the faces not dressed. But the f. c. of  
stone is built under  
the width of the wall  
cutting through the  
old crude brick  
wall. Elsewhere  
the stone wall  
is merely built  
against the old brick wall.

Examining also the stair along the  
"E" face of "S" part of pylon I. In 801, the  
face of pylon is dressed  
down to stone pavement 801-I  
and therefore the pylon was  
built while the old  
crude brick temple B 800-I  
was still in use. It  
is to be noted that the "N" wall of 801-II  
was built against the pylon and was  
therefore later in date.

a-b. face of  
pylon above this  
line is dressed  
flat as in  
room 801.  
Just below the line  
a-b the pylon  
face is slightly  
recessed to take other stones forming slope. Under  
this, the face of the pylon is only rough  
masonry. The stairway descends to floor I.  
Therefore, the stairway was built after the  
construction of the pylon and while floor I  
was still in use.
