It is now clear that (a) Atlanders built the temple (cols. in 702 and 703 and scattered inscribed stones, black granite altar, foundation deposit); (b) Senka-Amon-seken rebuilt it or restored it (pylon inscription on R face, recorded by Cailliaud, confirmed by frags. in debris in front, also intrusive inscription on black granite altar); (c) Some one during the Barkal Pyramid age rebuilt the rooms 708 and 704 (evidence of masonry, reused stones, sandstone statuette, Ram-headed statuette, miscellaneous small objects in 704).

- (15) 1 " axe [DRAWING] L 8.6
