In the afternoon, I removed the heap of pottery in the foundation deposit under the G.D. corner of 501 (see photos). Under these, there were a lot of small ball beads (unstrung), several small frags. of blue coloring matter and the following bronze models:

2 knives [DRAWING] L. 12.3. (one has traces of a bone handle).

4 adze blades. [DRAWING] L. 6.7-6.9 (two with decayed ends)

2 broad chisels [?] [DRAWING] L. 6.8 and 6.3

4 long (or narrow) chisels [DRAWING] L. 8; 7.5; 7.5; 6.5.

3 axe-heads [DRAWING] L. 4.2; 4; 3.6

1 frag. bone (fortuitous)

1 jar [DRAWING] solid handles. Ordinary brown ware as N.E. and late N. [X?]

2 vase [DRAWING] same ware
