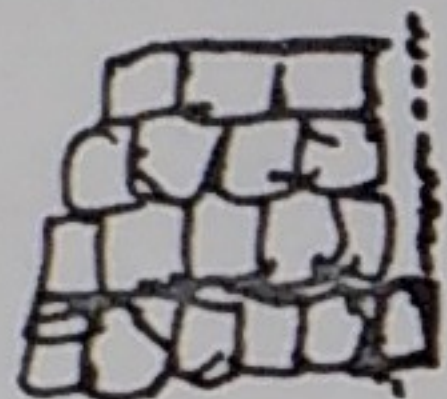

It appears to have been covered when the portico was built (provided it was found where it lies, a fact reached for by Jackson Pasha).

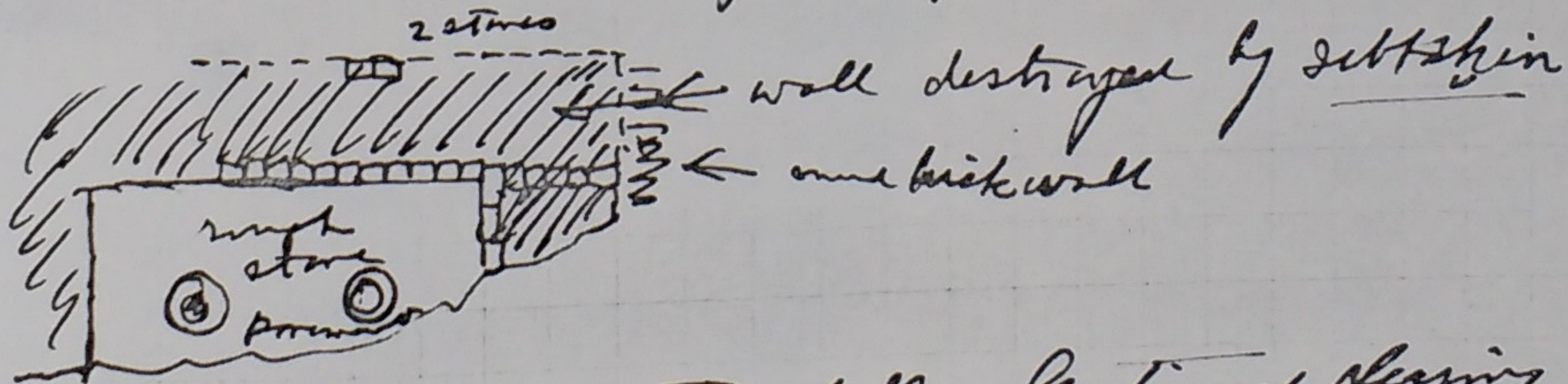
The room inside is filled with rubbish and a bank of red sand washed down from above. Over all broken building stones.
