(1) B 501 EX 1 + 2 Feb 22nd Continued clearing "Eastward" between the outside of "S" wall B 501 and the mud brick enclosing wall, as yesterday. Work confined to upper levels in sand and grey dirt. A number of blocks and frags. fallen from temple wall were removed. At present stage of work the outer face of "S" wall B 501 appears to be very much broken and no definite line of face could be picked up. The work has passed the door in centre "S" face B 501 and approaches causeway of the "S" railway line. (in 501 EX 1)

From just outside doorway into B 501 a small, dark brown, hard sandstone stela, bearing figure of the king wearing the war helmet and making offering to the ram-headed Amon standing left. Among considerably battered hieroglyphics running vertically between and above the two figures, the name [Drawing Hieroglyphs] is legible. The space below the figures is

blank, apparently an unfinished stela with the principal inscription never executed. L. 41.0 cm, W 28.0 cm.
