[DRAWING: hieroglyphs] No. 3 is a grey granit statue similar to the one W. of the N end of the Great Temple (in a hole; head at Merowe). The same thick heavy work. Head 1 seems to belong to this (same material and workmanship). The head was covered with plaster and painted (hence the unfinished appearance).

No. 4 is a smaller figure (life size) of a male, standing left foot advanced, head missing, garments left rough to take paint. Inscription: [DRAWING: hieroglyphs].

No. 5 is like no. 4 in size material & workmanship, but is a female (feet together). Only part of the inscription is visible [DRAWING: hieroglyphs].

Head 2 probably belongs to Taharka statue.
