900 for foundation deposits, - in vain.

In the great well (2) 1000 we
are now going down through drift
dirt mixed with heavy stone blocks.
On the R. side we are down ca. 400 cm.

At 509 and 500, clearing continued
(two Egyptians and 8 locals). In 510,
another $\frac{1}{2} \times 1$ ell block with the
beginning of a cartouche of Ramses II.



Also a large writing
block (broken in two)

lies on the floor of 510 and

came beyond any question from the roof
of this (or possibly 508 or 501). This
writing block of grey limestone has
the usual flying vulture and above the
