(3) Se-ka-Amon-seken—headless. Head (3) probably belongs. Bk-grey granite.

(4) Queen Amon-am-ren-nefer<sup>42</sup>

(5) Large fragment of heavy statue, other frags. scattered. Grey granite. Head (2).

(6) Torso of statue like no. 1. Surface scaly. Bk. granite 1.

(7) Lower part of statuette of [DRAWING: hieroglyphs] Prince of Aithiopia Thuty-mes.<sup>43</sup>
