The latest walls are not marked in the above sketch. The mud walls have to be greatly cut about by sebak digging. In the mud-brick room with the fragments of statues we cleared the R. U. quarter and swept the stone pavement. ^{The fragments form} ~~There are~~ four nearly complete statues, and ^{small} parts of two others. Until they are removed, no final attempt at fitting together can be made.

In the R. U. quarter only frags. of bases of some were found and a frag. of the grey granite statue of Amm-anul (3) from 500 A (no. 3). At present we have:

Head no. 4. Takarka, appears to fit on statue No. 2 in 500 A.

Statue no. 8. Amer^{gustan}-mer-ne-wuat, headless, bk-granite, (pieces 4 in p. 128).

Statue no. 9. Same (pieces 6, 7, 8 in p. 128).

Statue no. 10. Unidentified (pieces 5 + 9 in p. 128)

Statue no. 11. Sen ka-amn-sekur. On this fits head no. 3 found in 500 A.

Thus it is clear that the two groups came from the same place, no doubt the great temple (500) which lies between and were broken before removal from that place. The new group was clearly dumped into the mud-brick room with a lot of
