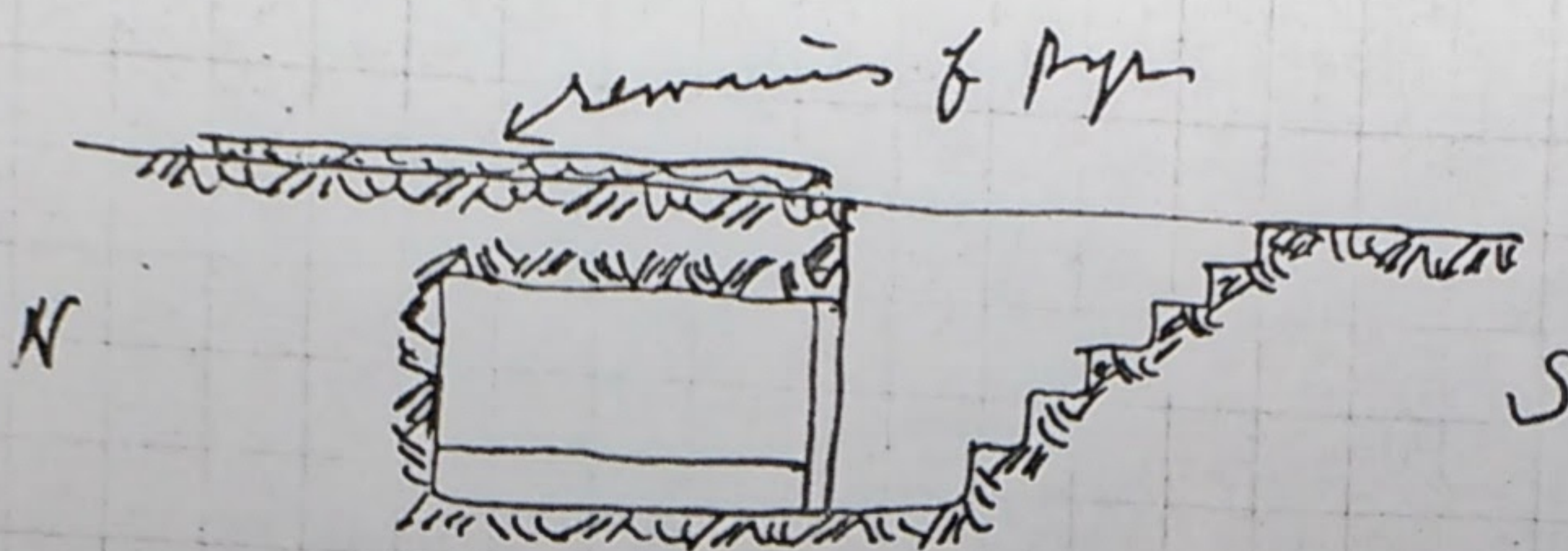

The chamber and stair are cut in the
grey sandstone. Both were filled with
a water packed debris (~~solid~~ as hard as
the most ancient alluvial banks). The
chamber had been completely plundered
(probably over 1000 years ago). In the
debris were fragments of two faience bowls
 one originally decorated in low relief
(pattern obscure). The body of the
fai. is a fine red material in one case
a fine grey in the other (more like pottery
than ^{Egypt.} fai.). There was also two scraps
of human bones (and a humerus).

- ⑥ At Temple aa the excavation of the
northern room (3 rows of cols. visible) is proceeding.
The walls are of mud brick, heavily cemented.
The cols are of sandstone, heavily cemented.
In the debris, some capitals  (open
papyrus flower capitals).
